CANSKATE 2026-2027 Season: CanSkate is a Learn to Skate program.

We offer [a one day, two day or three day](#) a week option that can be taken for the full season or for the shorter fall or winter sessions. The CanSkate program is a great way for skaters to learn the basics of skating whether they move into figure skating, hockey, speed skating or recreational skating for life.

CanSkate is open to all ages. It teaches basic skating skills and fundamental movements such as go forward, go backward, stop, turn, spin and jump. The program emphasizes fun and continuous movement. It is taught in a group lesson format and skaters are rewarded with official ribbons and badges as they progress through the stages. CanSkate is the flagship learn-to-skate program that has taught millions of Canadians to reach their recreational and competitive goals on the ice.

Parent/Assistant and Skater: Is part of our CanSkate learn to skate program.

Parent/Assistant and Skater is offered 1 day a week on an of the CanSkate sessions, the program is offered as ½ season sessions. The parent/assistant and Skater program is for skater off all ages that is in need of their parent/guardian or assistant on the ice to be successful or comfortable on the ice.

Note: The first day of skating will seem unorganized and chaotic but we assure you that it is under control. A lot of skaters within the CanSkate program may go through stages of crying and crawling, standing shuffling, walking, skating. Our program assistants and coach will do their very best to keep your child on the ice and engaged.

Refunds:

Refunds will be given before the start of the first skating day and up to the deadlines for each session. The Skate Canada/Skate Saskatchewan fee of \$78.20 is non-refundable. Withdrawals done before the start of the season will not be charged a processing fee.

After the start of the season the number of sessions skated will be deducted, as well as a processing fee of \$20.00, of the refund. Refund amounts are based on the date of receipt of written notice submitted during a CanSkate session or emailed to sk8battlefords@sasktel.net. Email must include the skater and parent names, skating day, address, and the reason for withdrawal. There is no refund for lessons completed prior to receipt of a written notice regardless of attendance. The Skate Canada/Skate Saskatchewan fee of \$78.20 is non-refundable.

Refunds will not be given after September 27th for the fall session or the full season. Refunds will not be given after January 16th for the winter session.

Note: Skaters who join after the withdrawal deadlines can withdraw until the end of their second scheduled class. The refund will be the total fee, less fees for 2 lessons already skated and the processing fee.

After the final deadlines, refunds will only be considered for medical reasons accompanied by a doctors note or in the case of “unusual circumstances” but will be at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Cancelled Classes: Skate Battlefords cannot make up a class or provide a refund if there is a cancellation due to circumstances beyond the control of Skate Battlefords, Town of Battleford, City of N. Battleford.

Program Assistants:

Program Assistants (PAs) are individuals who are continuously being trained by a CanSkate coach to assist in the delivery of the CanSkate program. Program Assistants are not certified coaches. Program Assistants are chosen from several different groups of people including current skaters at the club, former skaters, and skaters from other sports such as hockey or ringette. PAs are chosen based on many different factors but all program assistants are selected at the discretion of the coaches.

Coaches and PAs will do their best to make sure all skaters are with their designated group, unfortunately at times skaters do not wish to participate within the group dynamics. Skaters that will not participate will be checked on and encouraged to join the group but unfortunately, **we cannot provide one on one attention to CanSkaters.**

Just a reminder please refrain from asking your questions to the Program Assistants as it is not their job to answer questions about your child's progress or be up to date on the running of the club. They will however connect you with the coach in charge.

CanSkate Program Structure:

Each session runs for 1 hour. Skaters from the yellow / beginner group will practice off-ice before going on-ice and may only skate for 45min till they are comfortable and steady

Parents are not allowed on the ice for any reason. Parents are not allowed in the player's box unless your child needs your help with skates.

Stages your child will fit into & will go through: Crier, Crawler, Stander, Walker, Shuffler, Skater. Skaters are grouped by similar skill level and are assessed within the first few sessions of the season. As skaters progress, they may move to different group colours. However, if your child does not seem to be changing groups it does not mean they are not advancing, Skaters will progress through stages 1 and 2 faster than stages 3-6.

Each group has a Program Assistant and a program helper that stays with the group and moves them from station to station.

Warm up: The warm is about 10 mins and consists of general forward and backward skating around the perimeter of the rink as well as a full body movement and beginning skills.

- Skaters who are comfortable skating on their own will be allowed on the ice first once the Zamboni doors are closed and coaches/program assistants are on the ice.
- Non skaters or skaters who are not comfortable being on the ice alone or who need assistance will get an off-ice lesson near the entrance in preparation for their on-ice experience. A coach or PA will assist skaters onto the ice and provide guidance as best as possible.

Stations: The club uses a station circuit format. The circuits are used to cover a wide range of skills associated with each of the three areas Balance, Control, and Agility.

Circuit Stations: Consist of Fast Track, Balance, Control, Agility, Fun Zone, and Skill Development.

Cooldown: Last 5 – 10 min of each session. This is a group activity which allows full use of the ice, while allowing skaters to cool down in a safe manner after session.

The Program Structure may change from time to time as the coach sees fit and without notice

PROGRAM AWARDS: The CanSkate program curriculum is organized into six progressive stages of learning. Each stage is broken down into three fundamental areas: • Balance: Concentrating on forward skills, pushing technique, and edges

- Control: Concentrating on backwards skills, stopping and speed elements
- Agility: Concentrating on turning and jumping skills

Badges & Ribbons – There are 6 Stage Badges and 18 fundamental movement ribbons. To pass achieve a stage badge; skaters must acquire checkmarks for the related skills of each fundamental movement area ribbon (Balance, Control, Agility) at which time they will achieve the corresponding badge.



Equipment:

- CSA approved helmets are mandatory for all CanSkaters and must have a CSA sticker. Bicycle and ski helmets are not acceptable protection. Helmets with cages are optional.
- Knee pads and elbow pads are a good idea if you choose.
- Skates should fit just a finger or two bigger to accommodate for growth and blades should be on the duller side.
- Tie skates loose from the toe to just below the ankle, tighter in the ankle area, and looser at the top so skaters are able to bend their skates easily.
- Skate guards are a must-have to protect blades.
- Clothing: No bulky ski jackets, pants or jeans that are binding in the crotch area, stretchy is best.
Lighter jacket adding layers that can be taken off or on is best for maneuverability.
- Mitts that fit properly; coaches & PA's need to hold the hands of skaters to assist them

Helmet Policy:

- Parent and Tot, CanSkate, CanSkate upgrade. Power Skaters and Primary, up to and including stage 5 must wear a CSA approved helmet while on the ice.

- Bring a friend and family fun skates: Any participant who is not a registrant of Skate Canada must wear a CSA-approved hockey helmet, regardless of their skating ability or age, in accordance with Skate Canada Policy.

Communication:

Email – Canskate information will be sent out primarily by email from your Canskate parent rep, based on the email provided on the uplifter registration site. If you have not received an email from Skate Battlefords or your parent rep within the first month of skating please email Skate Battlefords to be sure we have your email correct.

THE THURSDAY AND SATURDAY CANSKATE PROGRAMMING CURRENTLY HAS NO PARENT REP REPRESENTING THESES CANSKATE GROUPS.

All programming communication is greatly helped by having a parent volunteer to sit on the Board of Directors represent each programming group.

The duties of a CanSkate Representative are: Communicate with the CanSkate Representative that goes to board meetings about concerns or questions you're your group, helping write and forwarding Canskate emails to your group's families, helping the event director to plan, find volunteers and execute events for your programming group.

Paper Handouts: Your child may be given a handout or colouring page at the end of a skating session. Please be sure to have a look for times and reminders on the back of the colouring page.

You can also talk to your coach directly with any questions you may have. Please be sure to wait until the end of a session to talk to your coach.

Skate Battlefords holds a number of events for your skater to participate and watch during the season.

Halloween Bring a Friend Skate, October 26th 5:45 – 6:45 for Monday,

- Skaters are encouraged to invite a friend to participate with them during their CanSkate session. Join us in the lobby after to participate in a craft and refreshment.
- All participants are required to wear a helmet regardless of age or ability in compliance with Skate Canada Policy. Unless they are above stage 5 and register with Skate Canada.

Holiday Celebration Monday December 7th 5:45 – 6:45

- Invite your family and friends to enjoy watching your kids and others from various stages within our skating club show off what they have learn so far in the season. Refreshments and snacks available for purchase. This is a free admission viewing open to the community.

Valentines Family fun Skate February 11th 5:30 – 6:30

- Skaters are encouraged to invite their family to join them on the ice for a family skate. Join us in the lobby for some extra fun.
- All participants are required to wear a helmet regardless of age or ability in compliance with Skate Canada Policy. Unless they are above stage 5 and register with Skate Canada.

Ice Show March 20th 2 – 4 @ the Access Communications Centre

- Every year the Skate Battlefords Club likes to showcase the talents and progress of our skaters with a year-end Ice Show.
- The Ice Show is a time for all families and the community to get together and celebrate the season's success of their skaters skating progress. All levels of skaters are encouraged to participate in the Ice Show.
- This is the skating clubs biggest fundraising event of the year. 50/50, flower sales, and raffle are available.

Parades Annually in August Town of Battleford & Northwest Territorial Days

- Skate Battlefords participates in both the Battleford and North Battleford parades in the summer. We welcome all past and present skaters and families to ride or walk in the parade with us. An email will be sent out to all the previous seasons registered skaters in July with more information.

PARENT/GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT:

- This code applies to all parents/guardians and others; supervising skaters who are registered with Skate Canada.
- Parents/guardians shall always abide by this code while participating in any Skate Battleford or Skate Canada event, competition, school, or activity.

- All parents/guardians are expected to conduct themselves in a responsible manner consistent with the values of fair play, integrity, open communication, and mutual respect. Parents shall always model positive responsible behaviour and communicate with their skater that they expect to do the same. Parents assume the major responsibility for their skaters on and off ice attitude.
- Parents shall always treat all individuals and property with courtesy and respect.
- Place the wellbeing and safety of their child above the training.
- Do not force your child to participate in sports, but do support their desire to participate in their chosen sport. Remember they should skate for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Parents should set reasonable expectations for their child's participation in skating focusing on development and enjoyment for the sport.
- Parents should instil confidence in their skater's ability and skill development, always avoiding comparison with other skaters.
- Parents along with the coach and the athlete, shall be considered members of a team whose main concern is the child's love of the sport, and overall progress and development. Parents shall respect that the coaches are responsible and empowered for on ice and off ice development of an athlete,
- Be courteous of your skater, other parents, other skaters, coaches, league officials, rink employees and visitors at all times.
- Insist that your child and other family members abide by the code of conduct, club rules and rink rules.
- Do not approach or otherwise distract coaches or skaters during scheduled skating or off ice training sessions. Coaches are not expected to leave the ice for consultations during a session unless it is an emergency.
- Exercise control and restraint when dealing with difficult issues. The use of abusive, threatening, or violent behaviour and or foul sexist, racist or abusive language in or around the grounds of the skating rink is strictly prohibited.
- Parents shall emphasize the importance of values like sportsmanship, respect, cooperation, and teamwork to their children.
- Parents should model and encourage their children to maintain a healthy balance between skating and life.
- Parents shall insure that their skater wear proper skating attire on and off the ice.
- Parents are expected to have their skaters at the rink in enough time for the skater to be prepared and on the ice for their designated skating time.
- Parents are expected to get their skater immediately after their child's skating time. Coaches are only responsible for your skater while they are in scheduled lesson times.
- It is the parent's responsibility to be sure your skater is being supervised during all other times.
- Parents are responsible for making sure they check their emails and /or Facebook for club communications.

- Never appear at the rink or any activity hosted by Skate Battlefords under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Parents must be sure to contact a coach with as much notice as possible if a skater is going to miss a lesson time. If enough advance notice is not given, the lesson may be charged anyways.
- Please be sure to pay coaches bills in a timely manner, this is a job and part of their income.
- Parents are not allowed in the player box or standing at the boards of the ice
- Please do not call or yell at your child from the stand while they are on the ice, as this cause distractions and can cause an accident.
